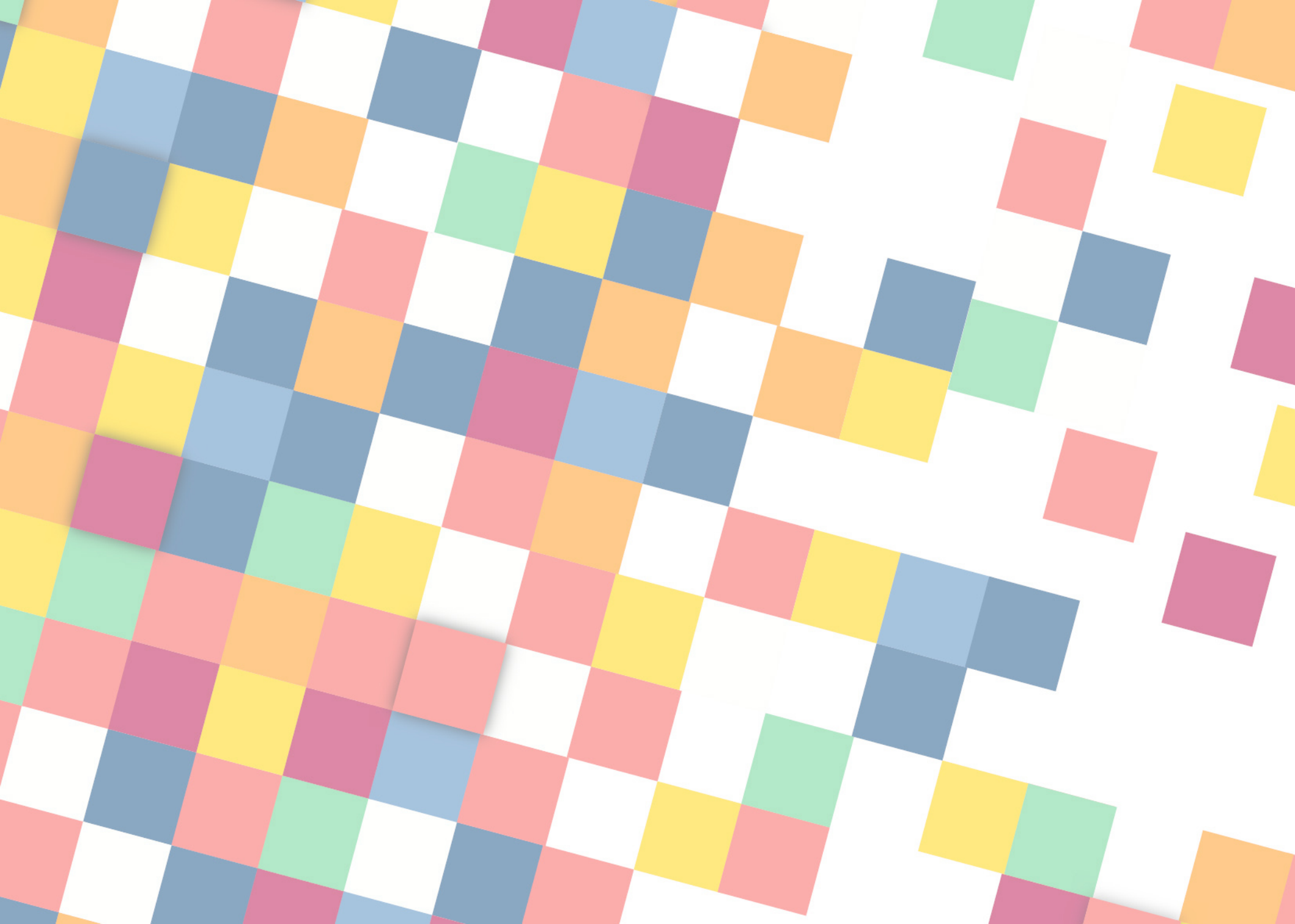

We recently had the incredible opportunity to participate in the Ideago Ideathon competition, which was centered around the theme of sustainability. Determined to contribute in our own way, we decided to tackle the urgent issue of microplastic pollution and showcase our innovative prototype—a water vacuum that collects these harmful particles.

From the beginning, we recognized the significance of such platforms in promoting sustainable solutions. While our original theme wasn't sustainability, we realized it wasn't unique, and we couldn't find a specific solution to the problem we had in mind. After much deliberation, we settled on the issue of microplastic pollution, as it resonated strongly with us and we understood the urgency of addressing its detrimental effects on the environment.

Throughout the process, we faced various technical challenges, but we sought guidance from experts in the field to improve the functionality and efficiency of our water vacuum. Additionally, we engaged in public speaking workshops to enhance our presentation skills, ensuring that our passion for sustainability would shine through during the pitch.

Participating in the competition not only allowed us to showcase our prototype but also exposed us to industry experts and potential collaborators. The feedback we received from the panel of judges was crucial in refining our concept and opening doors to future collaborations.

Moving forward, we aspire to collaborate with relevant stakeholders, including environmental organizations, government agencies, and research institutions, to make our prototype accessible and widely implemented, effectively reducing the presence of microplastics in water bodies.

MR. AU YEUNG

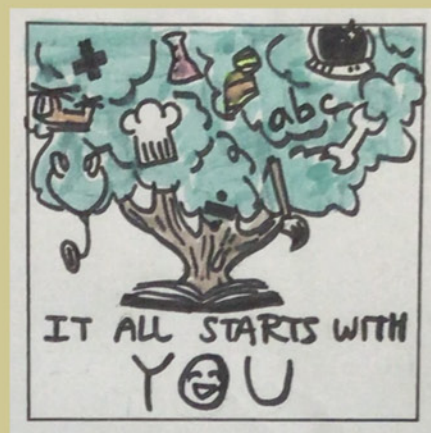
The GP Family Kick-Off event was an incredibly exciting experience. It provided an opportunity for me to meet my GP children, who were full of energy and enthusiasm.

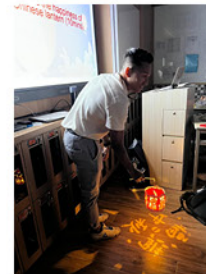




3B HU JOANNA IRIS

Marine Conservation Program

Over the past year, I have had the privilege of participating in two important marine conservation initiatives – caring for juvenile horseshoe crabs and earning my open water scuba certification. These experiences have deepened my appreciation for the delicate ocean ecosystems and motivated me to become a more active steward of our marine environments.

Beginning in the spring, I joined a local horseshoe crab rehabilitation and release program. As part of this effort, I worked with a team to receive juvenile

horseshoe crabs from the City University of Hong Kong, set up specialized tanks to care for them, and monitor their growth until they were mature enough to be safely released back into the wild. It was a rewarding experience to play a hands-on role in supporting the conservation of these ancient creatures, which are vital to the coastal food web but face threats from habitat loss and overharvesting.

In addition to the horseshoe crab work, I recently completed an open water scuba diving certification program. This training not only taught me essential

skills for safe diving, but also deepened my knowledge of marine biology and the need for coral reef conservation. Exploring the vibrant, yet fragile, underwater ecosystems firsthand was a humbling experience. I was shocked to see the extent of coral bleaching and other signs of distress, which reinforce the urgent threats posed by climate change, pollution, and other human impacts. This experience has motivated me to use my new scuba certification to participate in reef monitoring and restoration projects in the future.

The university counsellor provides extensive counselling services for the students and families of Glee Path.

For IB students, there are weekly university counselling classes where students are given the opportunity to learn how to write resumes, personal statements, and polish their portfolio in preparation for highly competitive admissions.
