- To broaden students' knowledge and global awareness by regularly reviewing and refining the curriculum to ensure relevance, alignment, and coherence across subjects
- To strengthen students' generic skills, especially critical thinking, problem solving, creativity, and self-directed learning, through structured project-based learning and retrieval-based practices
- To enhance teaching effectiveness and student performance by using assessment data and item analysis to identify learning gaps, refine pedagogies, and promote shared professional accountability among teachers

1. Major Concern: Nurturing a learning community by strengthening students' learning skills and enhancing their learning motivation

Briefly list the feedback and follow-up actions from the previous school year:

The department will continue to explore cross-curricular learning activities for various topics in the coming year. We aim to expand project-based interdisciplinary learning to include other forms, making sure these opportunities are clearly highlighted in our teaching schemes and assessments for systematic incorporation. Additionally, we will strengthen our training initiatives through subject panel meetings and ad-hoc sessions to promote the effective use of these platforms. Next year, AI will be a major focus, and it is important to begin implementing school-wide applications while conducting workshops for both teachers and students. Our plan includes integrating more AI and IT tools to facilitate interactive lessons (such as Nearpod), content preparation (like Google Notebook and Gemini), and multimedia production.

Briefly list the feedback and follow-up actions from the previous school year:

Building on last year's progress, the school will further integrate positive education across all subjects, focusing on life skills like resilience, gratitude, and empathy. Teachers will enhance lesson planning with inclusive strategies and diverse assessments. Professional development will prioritize ongoing workshops on pedagogy and student support. Mental health initiatives will expand with the DASS-21 screening tool and increased support from the MindHK program. Mindfulness sessions and well-being check-ins will be included in the school routine. Support for SEN students will grow through Level-Up Classes. The school will also strengthen parental engagement and celebrate student achievements to foster a positive, inclusive culture.
